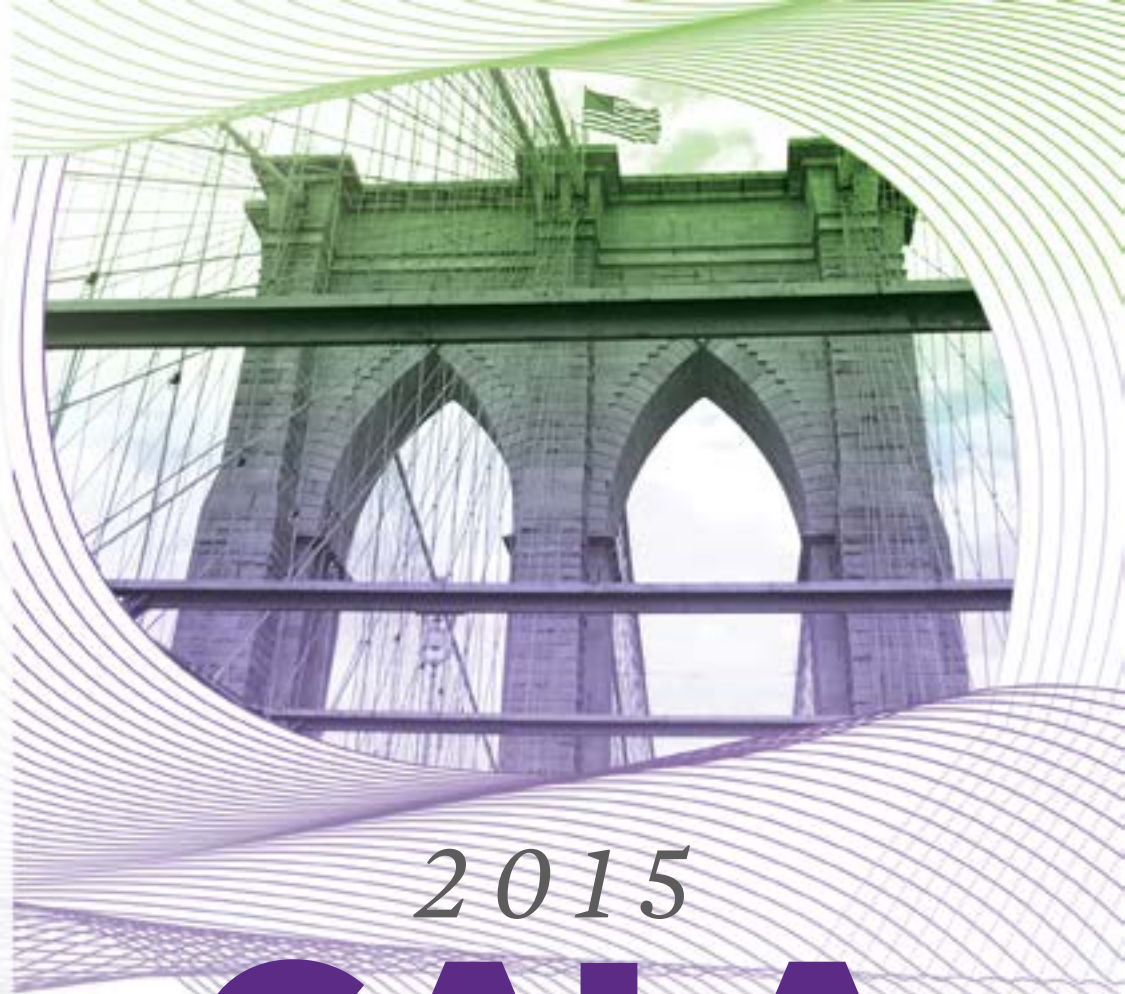

MARTIN LIPTON: As Board Chairman of NYU since 1988, Martin Lipton has led the school, which transformed itself into a global network university during his tenure, with great distinction. He was a guiding force behind the merger of NYU with Polytechnic University, the country's second oldest stand-alone engineering school, and we

honor him for his visionary leadership in adding Engineering to the nation's largest private research institution.

Lipton, who earned a B.S. in Economics from the Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania, graduated from the NYU School of Law in 1955. He is a founding partner of the highly regarded firm Wachtell, Lipton, Rosen & Katz, where he specializes in advising major businesses on matters affecting corporate policy and strategy. He has written and lectured extensively on those topics and is perennially featured on lists of the most influential and respected attorneys in the country.

An emeritus member of the Council of the American Law Institute and a director of the Institute of Judicial Administration, he is also on the Executive Committee of the Partnership for New York City, which he co-chaired for several years. He holds a membership in the American Academy of Arts & Sciences and has been awarded the title of Chevalier de la Légion d'Honneur. Additionally, he is an Emeritus Chairman of Prep for Prep, having helmed the organization's board for more than a decade.
